June 1 AM: Harvest Outreach

Harvest Outreach is a food distribution center that serves approximately 5000 needy persons within the Racine community. Volunteers from our congregation help distribute the food and complete the necessary paperwork. Food contributions are received from area churches and organizations as well as the government. You are always welcome to give monetary donations to Harvest Outreach using the wooden box near the Welcome Center.

June 1 PM: HOPES Center

On any given night between 200 and 350 people experience homelessness in Racine County - HOPES aids these people. Their Street Outreach teams serve people who are unsheltered, those people who are homeless and sleep in places not meant for human habitation, like benches, parks, abandoned buildings, woods, tents and cars. Their PATH program helps people who are experiencing or who are at risk of homelessness and who also have a mental health challenge. Our RAPID REHOUSING program uses Racine's Coordinated Entry System to help people move out of Racine's shelter.

June 8 AM: RCS

Our gifts go toward the general fund of Racine Christian School in supporting our commitment of Christian education. Parents who believed in the importance of Christian education for their children started RCS with a strong commitment to Godcentered learning based on the Reformed belief for their covenant youth.
